Northumbria University came in to school on Tuesday 22nd to speak to some of our year 12 students about writing personal statements. The session went through the UCAS process and showed students examples of good and bad statements.



Stargazing at Sussex - Wednesday 23rd January

Year 8 goes astronomical! 15 students went to Sussex for a Stargazing trip. They learned about the smallest building blocks - quarks - up to stars and galaxies that make up the universe. Thank you to the science department for organising and Mark Wood for driving the minibus.



Exploring Healthcare at St Georges University

On Thursday 24th of January, a group of aspiring medics travelled to St. George's University for a workshop on interview skills, work experience guidance and hands-on clinical tasks. It was a fantastic trip in which students learnt about the different pathways into medicine and how broad it is as a field. The students were taught about the 8 key competencies that universities focus on in their interviews in which the students used their own work experience to see how they have met these. Mini Medical Interviews are growing popular within the universities and our students tried answering past questions but also evaluated the question in order to understand why they were being asked it. One of the best examples was teaching someone to tie their shoelaces without hand gestures - Kacper did a fantastic job doing this showing that he could keep calm under pressure but also demonstrated fantastic communication and empathy skills. We were then taken to mock clinical rooms where students were taught how to use spirometers, take someone's pulse and give CPR using the song 'staying alive'. A brilliant trip in which all students have commented was helpful and have made them more excited about their future - plus they got their own stethoscope.
