Art

The aim of A Level Fine Art is to enable students to develop a broad range of practical art skills and concepts, to gain a wider understanding of art movements throughout history, and to give learners the knowledge, understanding and skills that they need for employment or higher education

The course is taught by three art teachers to give a broad range of knowledge and skills. Each teacher covers a separate unit (Portraiture, Still Life and Landscapes). Students then complete a final coursework unit on the topic of their choice. Students undertake a practical art examination at the end of the course.

Visits to galleries, museums and art colleges help students to gain a wider contextual knowledge of art and art history.

Photography, Product Design, Media Studies and Drama are suitable combinations for A Level Fine Art.
