Dear Students, Staff, and Parents & Carers,

As you know, the well-being of our students is at the heart of everything we do here at Carshalton Boys Sports College. However, it's no secret that mental health challenges are affecting young people across the country, and our school is not immune. This is a complex issue with various contributing factors, including academic pressures, social media, and the ongoing impact of the pandemic. We want to assure you that we are committed to providing a safe and supportive environment where students feel comfortable seeking help and navigating challenges.

We have several initiatives in place:

Dedicated Pastoral Care Team: Our trained staff are here to listen to students' concerns and offer personalized support. They work closely with other professionals, including counselors and family liaison officers, to ensure a holistic approach.

Mental Health Awareness Activities: We integrate mental health awareness throughout the curriculum and school events. This includes workshops on resilience, mindfulness, and coping mechanisms, empowering students to take charge of their well-being.



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Early Intervention: We actively identify students who might be struggling and offer early intervention measures. This could involve individual support, group sessions, or access to external resources.

Seek Help When Needed: Reach out to us or external professionals if you're concerned about your child's mental health.

Remember, you are not alone in this. We are here to support you and your child every step of the way. Please don't hesitate to contact your child's form tutor, Head of Year, or pastoral team member if you have any questions or concerns. We believe that by working together – school, families, and external support networks – we can create a supportive environment where all our students can thrive.

Year 7: War Poetry

This unit incorporates important history context to go alongside a range of poetry written for a range of purposes: to criticise war; to encourage men in WWI and WW2 to join the war effort; and poetry written by soldiers to explore their war experiences. Y7 will be learning and utilising key poetry subject terminology to explore their understanding of poetry across a range of purposes.

Year 9: The Woman in Black

In order to lay a foundation for the Victorian Gothic elements of A Christmas Carol, Y9 will be reading The Woman in Black. With a huge focus on analysing how the writer creates effect and atmosphere, Y9 will also be honing their creative writing skills, ready for their GCSE English Language assessments.

Year 8: Romeo & Juliet


Y8 are building on their prior poetry analysis skills to apply this to a reading of Shakespeare's Romeo and Juliet. The aim of this unit is to break down the barriers of language and foster an enjoyment of Shakespeare's plays. To prepare for their Y9 study of Macbeth, they will be focusing on the tragic hero and the structure of Shakespeare's tragedies.

Year 10: An Inspector Calls

Diving into one of the key GCSE English Literature texts, our students are using and developing the analytical skills we have developed throughout KS3 to tackle Priestley's text, before developing GCSE English Language later in the term.

Year 11: Summer Prep

As we near the run-in to the Summer examinations, we are currently operating on a (roughly) weekly schedule revising the key areas of: Macbeth, A Christmas Carol, Lord of the Flies, Poetry Anthology, Unseen Poetry and both Language papers. This is to provide a foundation for students to build on with their own revision outside of the classroom.



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Poetry

This year, the students have had some fantastic opportunities to be creative with our poetry. Joshua C (Y7) was the winner of our recent 'Poetry Slam', thanks to a fantastic poem exploring sustainability.

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
Poetry

Theatre Trips

In the English department, we seek a wide range of opportunities to engage with the texts that we study. As well as using film adaptations, we organise trips for students.

On 5th December 2023, Year 10 visited the Wimbledon Studio Theatre for a performance of one of our set texts for GCSE, *A Christmas Carol* by Charles Dickens. The studio theatre is situated below the main theatre and stages smaller productions. This production saw two actors take on over 30 characters as they retold the Victorian classic and we occupied all of the seats for the performance. The boys were amazed at how versatile the actors were and enjoyed spotting the key quotes they had learnt that term.

Year 11 had the opportunity on 16th November 2023 to watch *A Christmas Carol* at The Old Vic. Christopher Ecclestone played Ebenezer Scrooge in London's longest running adaptation of the novella and the audience were treated to mince pies, satsumas, music and merriment as part of the performance. It was a late night out but a really enjoyable evening for us all.



The Globe Theatre – Year 8

On 25th March, Year 8 have a rewards trip to watch *Romeo and Juliet*, the play they are currently studying, at the Globe Theatre in London. Jack Petchey





Their aim is to amplify young people's voices by building confidence, developing skills and creating platforms for young people to share their stories and ideas to empower not only themselves but each other. It was amazing to see the students gain more confidence as the day progressed and learn about each other in ways they may not get to do in a regular classroom environment. Football Highlights so far

It has been a hectic but successful and enjoyable year so far for our football teams. Our year 7 team have bedded in well under the stewardship of Mr Way and Mr Kyprianou. The team have reached the semi final of the Sutton Cup as well as the second round in Surrey's and the 4th round of the nationals. Our year 8 team have kicked on from last season which has seen them reach the 4th round of the National Cup the 3rd round of the Surrey Cup as well as currently leading the way in the league and in the quarter finals of the Sutton Cup. The second year 8 team have also computed well this year with a highlight reaching the last 16 of the national cup, an incredible achievement. Year 9 have continued their strong form of the last few years with Mr Watkins. They are currently flying high in the league as well qualifying for the quarter finals of both the Surrey and Sutton Cups. Year 10 has had a strong year to date so far with Mr Szreider at the helm. They have qualified for the quarter finals of both the Surrey and Sutton cups as well as making it impressively through to Round 5 of the Nationals where after a long trip to Herne Bay they were eventually beaten. Year 11 have also competed well with Mr Jackson having reached the 5th round of the national cup, and the 4th round in Surrey Cup and aim to reach the final of the Sutton Cup.

Our footballing success does not stop on home soil. In October our year 9 students took on three teams from Holland on their Amsterdam tour and won with an aggregate score of 35-6 across 6 games.

Basketball highlights this year

As a school we continue to develop our basketball skills and go from strength to strength in our teams within competitions. In Year 7 & 8 we have had over 100 boys attending Basketball Club every week working hard to enhance their experience and skills. In regards to inter school competitions we have managed to play over 25 games this year across 6 year groups from U12-U18s. The highlight of the year was the U16 side who along with the demands of their GCSE's managed to reach the semi finals of the Surrey Cup beating the likes of Rutlish and Greenshaw along the way. We look forward to competing and continuing our upwards trajectory in the sport.

Handball highlights this year

This term has also seen handball start its annual tip off. The year 10 and year 11 teams have started the year strongly both with unbeaten records. Each team has had victories against Glenthorne, Wallington Boys and Sutton Harris. After the half term break, handball will really heat up with the year 8 and year 10 National competitions starting. There has also been a positive start to the year 7 and year 8 training clubs with excellent attendance and attitude with players of the future to look out for.

Flying start for Year 7

The year thus far has seen our Year 7 Football Team go from strength to strength. From a trial in September seeing over 200 boys attend across a three day period. We have had over 150 year 7s attending Football Enrichment every Monday after school to work closely with the PE Department to enhance their skills and tactics.

We have been fortunate enough this year to provide opportunities for over 75 year 7s to represent Carshalton Boys in competitive football fixtures against other Schools, including Wilsons, Sutton Grammar and Wimbledon College. Fixtures have seen the Y7 'A' Team Travel a far as Beths Grammar School in Bexley, play every day of the week (including a handful of Saturday mornings) which is a testament to their commitment. The Y7 'A' team have played 15 games to date, winning 10 and drawing 2, with notable wins coming against Glenthorne 8-2 and Three Rivers Academy 3-0 in the National Cup 2nd Round.

Other Sporting Successes

This term KS3 has studied first aid, components of fitness and principles of training as part of our theory unit of work. Regarding practical PE, students across all years have been studying sports ranging from American football to table tennis. We can't wait to begin delivering our new Physical movement unit of work which will give students an in-depth knowledge of trampolining, dance, vaulting and floor gymnastics.



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The Brilliant Club

During Autumn term, number of keen Y8 students have been taking part of a scholar program run by "The Brilliant Club". In this program, the students were given weekly tutorials by Dr Sophie Banks over 6 weeks in which they learned to analyse literary texts from a number of different points of view. At the end of the course, based on their discussions in the classes, they were asked to write an essay, using literary analysis to inform readers about the different points of view of one of a choice of texts. These were then to be marked by Dr Banks using university style marking.

At university, the grade system is "Ist" for best grades then "2:1", "2:2", "3rd" and "pass".

All but one of the students that took part obtained a 2:1 or above and **half of the students got a 1st class for their essay**! They will be going to The Courtauld Institute in central London on February 22nd to take part in a graduation ceremony with a number of other schools which have taken part – a great opportunity to meet other students and to experience a university setting for a day.





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
