

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Half Term Disneyland Paris Trip

Over February Half Term a group of sixth formers went to Paris with Miss Hennell and Mr Szreider! The trip consisted of 4 action packed days with non-stop activities from sightseeing to theme parks to academic workshops and seminars.

Day I: Students were at school bright and early ready for a big day of travel with the coach journey and the ferry across to Paris. Once we arrived in France we settled into our hotel, had a quick trip to the shops and then went into Disney Village for a first sneak peek at Disney and some dinner!

Day 2: Paris! We had a very big day in Paris with an early start and a day full of shopping, eating and sightseeing. Students have got to experience the Eiffel Tower with a trip to the top floor with a stunning 360 degree views of Paris. Sights were also visited such as Sacré-Cœur, Arc De Triomphe, Place de la Concorde and Moulin Rouge! We hit the famous Champs-Élysées for some shopping as well as the souvenir shops and crêperies of Montmartre. 
In lessons pupils have been exploring different play texts as well as creating their own performances – well done Y7!




Academic Update
