These outcomes are a testament to the hard work of our students and the unwavering support they've received from their families and our dedicated staff. We are incredibly proud of all they have accomplished.

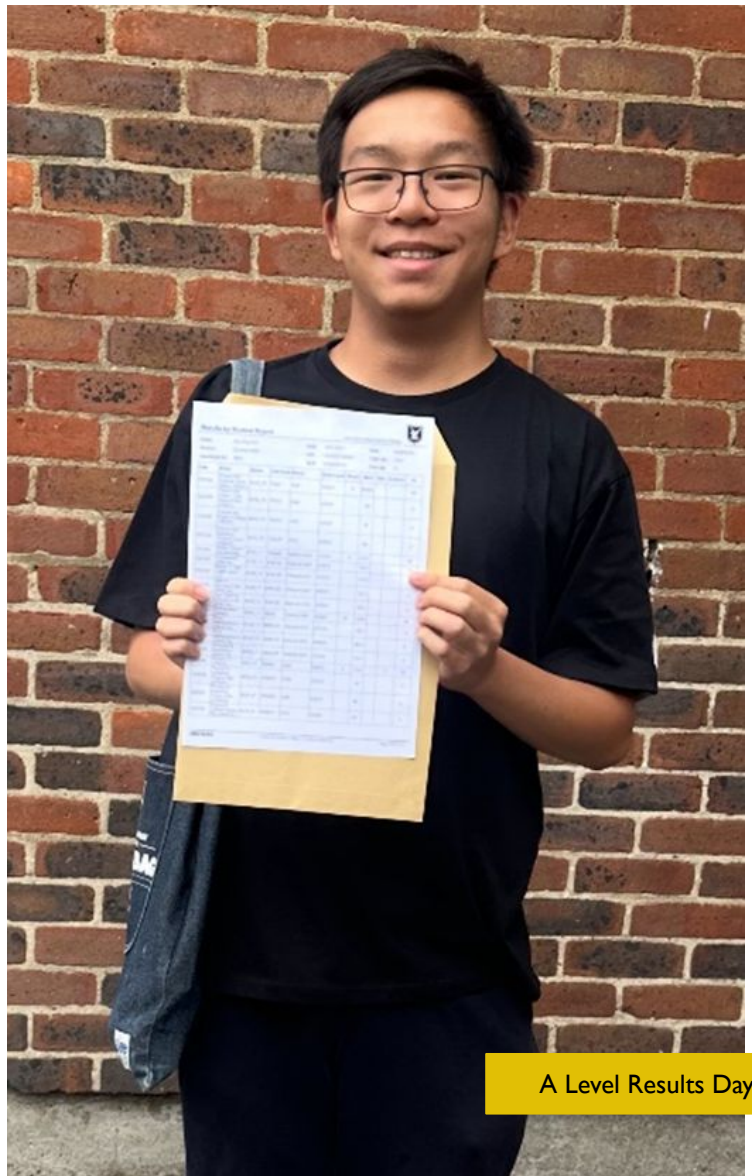
Year 11

Importance of Reading & WOTC

Daily reading is essential for building your child's vocabulary and comprehension, which benefits their learning both in and out of the classroom. To support their overall development, it's important to encourage them to take breaks from screen time and read for pleasure, not just for schoolwork.

We're committed to improving our students' communication and literacy skills. By working together, we can ensure your child has a strong foundation for future learning. Our school library, led by our amazing librarian, is a fantastic resource that all students should use.

To help your child become a strong, independent learner, it is crucial that they complete **Work Outside the Classroom (WOTC)**. They should have a quiet, distraction-free space to work, such as a dining table or desk. This space should also be visible to you so you can prompt and support them if needed.

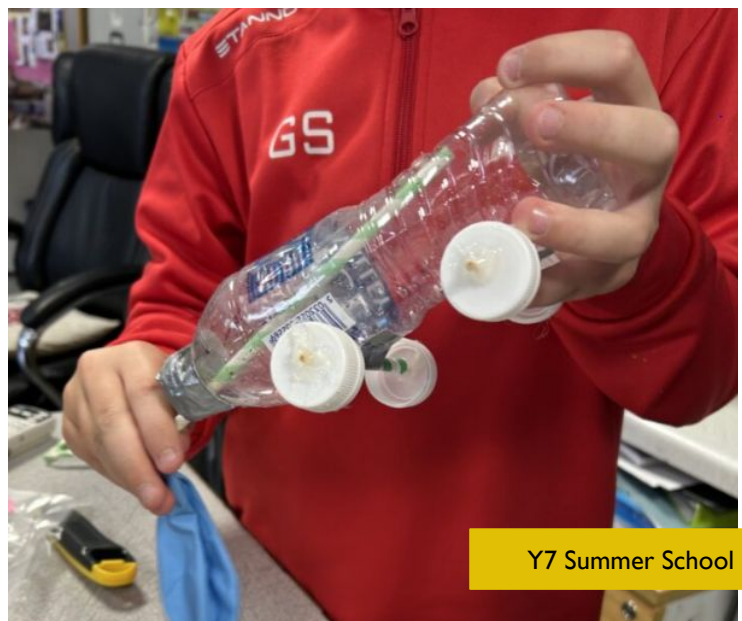

Behaviour & Culture

Mobile Phones - Year 7 to Year 11 (sixth form information can be found in the welcome page [HERE](#))

At CBSC we operate a no phone policy. Phones should not be out or visible unless directed by a teacher or member of staff. If students have their phones out, they will be asked to put them away. If a student refuses or is found to repeatedly have their phone out, this will be confiscated. If a student argues about this or becomes out of verbal control or their behaviour deteriorates further, their parent/carer will be asked to collect the phone on their behalf

Completing Homework (Work Outside The Classroom - WOTC)

We prefer students to complete WOTC on a computer/laptop or Chromebook (where possible). This is because students in most cases, mobile phones are a distraction. We do understand that not all students have exclusive access to a computer/laptop/Chromebook, so mobile phones can be used in these situations.

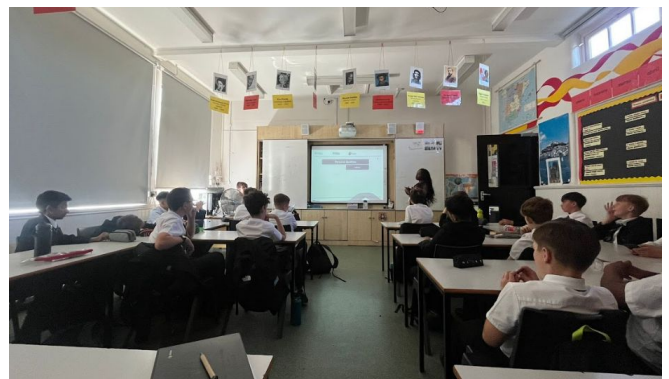

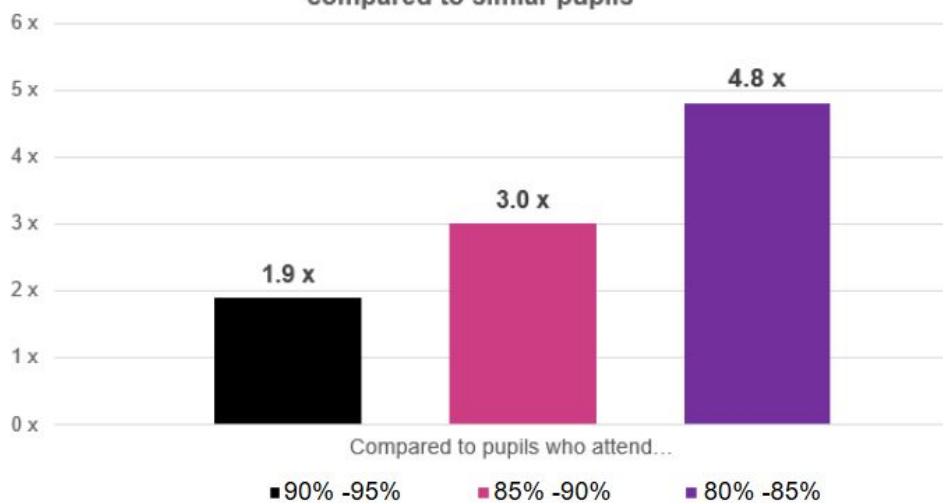
This academic year, students are expected to demonstrate high standards of punctuality and attendance.

All students must be in their tutor base by 8:30am sharp. Any student arriving to tutor time or assembly after 08:30am without a valid reason will receive a whole school detention on the same day after school.

Attendance is essential for academic success. Students are expected to attend school every day, except in extreme circumstances. While we understand that some illness-related absences are unavoidable, we encourage students to attend where possible. If we have concerns about a student's attendance, parents will receive supportive contact from the school so we can work together to ensure the best outcomes.

Medical appointments should be arranged outside of school hours, and holidays during term time will not be authorised.

You will no longer be able to leave a voicemail message. Please DO NOT call the admin team or reception to report any form of student absence. Only report absences via email or MCAS

To report a student absent from school, for any reason, please email attendance@carshaltonboys.org or send a message via the My Child At School app (MCAS).

This includes messages regarding:

- a student who is going to be absent from school (please include the reason for the absence)
- a student has an appointment either on the day or in the future
- is going to be delayed in coming into school
- needs to leave early for an appointment (medical etc)

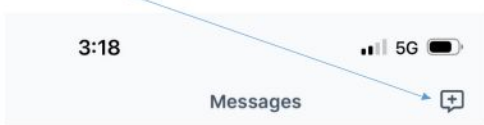

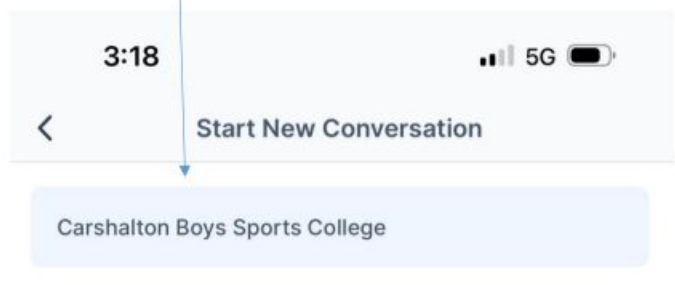

Year 12 Work Experience

Year 12 Work Experience will take place between Monday 6th July and Friday 10th July. All Year 12 students are all expected to undertake relevant Work Experience during Year 12. Please see the letter which was included in 6th Form enrolment pack, which outlines finer details and logistics for this invaluable experience.

Parents / carers should note that work experience does not always have to align specifically with future careers aspirations. For instance some sectors do not offer work experience to people under the age of 18. We encourage our students to explore high quality work experience opportunities where transferable and relevant skills can be found.

It is possible, for work experience to be undertaken outside of the stated window in July. This does need to be discussed and approved.

Year 10 Work Experience

This year we are introducing work experience into Year 10. This will be a 5 day experience and will offer a tremendous opportunity for our Year 10 students to enhance their studies with relevant workplace skills development. Communications will be sent out in September outlining the dates, process and logistics of planning for and securing a Work Experience in Year 10.

Key Stage 3 Work Shadowing

Understanding and exploring careers and the workplace is so important in raising aspirations and consolidating progression pathways. This year our key stage 3 students will be given an opportunity to undertake work shadowing. This is a short duration opportunity where young people observe an employee (often from family / family friends network) whilst they are undertaking their day to day duties in a work setting.

Year 7 & 8: Will have a 1 day work shadowing day. Communication will be sent out in September outlining the date, process and logistics of planning for and securing a work shadow day.

Year 9: Will have a 3 day work shadowing experience. Communication will be sent out in September outlining the dates, process and logistics of planning for and securing a work shadow experience.

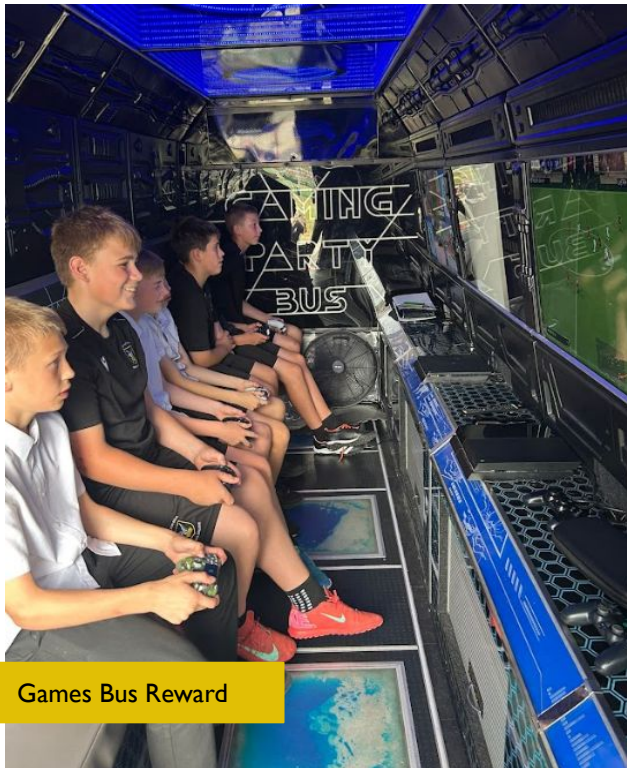

Sixth Form Dress Code (everyday)

Smart Casual Dress code for normal school days below.

Short sleeved tops	No inappropriate logos, images, words. Must cover midriff at all times. Neckline should be close to the collar bone, suitable for a professional environment. Team Tops are not permitted.
Long sleeved tops	No inappropriate logos, images, words. Must cover midriff at all times. Neckline should be close to the collar bone, suitable for a professional environment. Team Tops are not permitted.
Vest Tops	Must have thicker straps, fully covering underwear. Must cover midriff at all times. Neckline should be close to the collar bone, suitable for a professional environment. Team Tops are not permitted.
Jumpers	No inappropriate logos, images, words. Must cover midriff at all times. Neckline should be close to the collar bone, suitable for a professional environment.
Trousers / Jeans	No ripped or patched trousers / denim. Tracksuit bottoms are not permitted. No underwear should be visible
Leggings	Must not be so thin that underwear is visible through leggings. No sports or leisure leggings. Leggings with panels to enhance body shape are not permitted.
Cycling shorts	Must not be so thin that underwear is visible through cycling shorts. Cycling shorts with panels to enhance body shape are not permitted. Cycling shorts to be at least mid-thigh length and should not be shorter when walking or sitting (think carefully about material)
Shorts	Shorts to be at least mid-thigh length and should not be shorter when walking or sitting (think carefully about material) Shorts should be smart, tailored. No board shorts, jersey shorts, sports shorts etc.
Skirts	Skirts to be at least mid-thigh length and should not be shorter when walking or sitting (think carefully about material)
Dress	Must have thicker straps, fully covering underwear. Neckline should be close to the collar bone, suitable for a professional environment. Dress to be at least mid-thigh length and should not be shorter when walking or sitting (think carefully about material)
Head wear	Hats / caps etc. are not permitted in school building
Footwear	Footwear must be both safe and appropriate for professional environment. Sliders, Crocs and other similar footwear are not permitted.
Jewellery	Jewellery should be conservative No visible facial piercings e.g. lips or nose

Sixth Form Dress Code (exams and other specified events)

There are occasions where students are required to wear smart business wear. This includes internal / external examinations, some trips, leadership events, some visiting speakers, and some careers events. Students should wear attire suitable for interview. Students must wear: Shirt and Tie (short sleeve shirts are permitted in the summer examinations), Smart trousers, skirt, dress, Smart shorts are acceptable for summer exams and Smart shoes.

Please refer to guidance above regarding acceptable length of skirts, dresses and shorts.

Students are not allowed to wear, jeans, trainers or casual footwear



Sixth Form Uniform

Enrichment Uniform (sports activities)

Students will have an enrichment lesson where they can choose from a range of activities. Where students select sports activities, they should note the following acceptable items:

Short sleeved tops	No inappropriate logos, images, words. Must cover midriff at all times. Neckline should be close to the collar bone, suitable for a professional environment. Team Tops are not permitted.
Vest Tops	Must have thicker straps, fully covering underwear. Must cover midriff at all times. Neckline should be close to the collar bone, suitable for a professional environment. Team Tops are not permitted.
Cycling shorts	Must not be so thin that underwear is visible through cycling shorts. Cycling shorts with panels to enhance body shape are not permitted. Cycling shorts to be at least mid-thigh length and should not be shorter when walking or sitting (think carefully about material)
Leggings	Must not be so thin that underwear is visible through leggings. No sports or leisure leggings. Leggings with panels to enhance body shape are not permitted.

Students are required to change for a sports enrichment lesson and to change back into appropriate attire after the session.

Chelsea Academy Kit

Squad members are permitted to wear their kit in school outside of training times. It is a requirement that the full kit is worn. Partial kit is not permitted. Squad members cannot replace kit items with preferred sporting wear.

Actions When Students Do Not Dress In Line With Dress Code

It is an expectation that students do adhere to dress code. In the event of a dress code infringement, students will be given the following options.

- Wear a Sixth Form Hoodie / T-shirt. Stock available in Sixth Form office for short term loan.
- To contact home and have appropriate clothes brought into school.
- To go home and change, as long as parents can be reached in advance.
- To work with the Sixth Form learning mentor.

Role of Parents/Carers

Parents/carers have an important role in supporting the school's behaviour policy and should be encouraged to reinforce the policy at home as appropriate. Where a parent/carer has a concern about management of behaviour, they should raise this directly with the school while continuing to work in partnership with them.

At Carshalton Boys Sports College we endeavour to improve the life chances for each young person within our care. Parents/carers can track and monitor their child's progress, behaviour and achievement at school using the **Bromcom Parent/Carer App, My Child At School (MCAS)** and we urge all parents/carers to utilise this tool.

My Child At School (MCAS)

MCAS is a system designed for parents to do the following

- Check your child's attendance
- Monitor their behaviour
- Look at homework (Work Outside the Classroom - WOTC)
- Order uniform, pay for trips and top up food accounts
- View data that the school holds for you/your child



Please ensure you have signed up to the App, to ensure you can support your child at home with their Work Outside The Classroom and their rewards & sanctions as appropriate

How to Sign Up

You can download the My Child At School app via the Apple App Store or Google Play Store.

Search for **'MyChildAtSchool'** (which will be listed by the publisher Bromcom Computers PLC).

If using a computer, please browse to <https://www.mychildatschool.com/>

1. **If using the app you will be asked to allow it to send you notifications. Please choose "Allow/Yes"**
2. **Select "Self Sign Up" (app) or "Sign Up" website)**
3. **Enter the school postcode (SM5 IRW) and select "continue"**
4. **Enter your email address and select "Sign Up"**

It is important that you enter the email address that you have registered with the school.

You will subsequently receive an email which will enable you to set a password to login to the system.

The first time you login you will be prompted to choose a 5 digit pin that will be used for subsequent logins (instead of your password). If your device supports it, you will also have the option to turn on biometric authentication.
